



Local Food Tour

Take a look at our favourite list of places around Prague. Some of them are quiet and non-touristy, some of them vibrant and lively:

Werichova vila – have a delicious dessert in a house of Czech actor, Werich, who acted in Shakespear’s play on Broadway. With a cigar and an ashtray placed on his desk, the house looks like he has just left it even though he died over 40 years ago. There is something terrifying hidden in the cellar...

Špejle – vibrant atmosphere, modern food, Czech-style tapas.

Kantýna – carnivore paradise, everything meat-related, from steak tartar to roast bone marrow and tripe soup.

Kuchyň – don’t expect to get a menu. They’ll invite you to the kitchen to take a look around.

Karlštejn castle – surrounded by sexy hills and located half-an-hour romantic train-ride from Prague. Charles IV, a holy roman emperor and bohemian king, used to chill here in a chapel full of holy relics.

Kulový blesk – just another cellar frequented by beer-loving locals.

Zlatý kříž – mom and pop deli where you stand while you eat your classical open-faced sandwich made of top ingredients.

Vyšehrad – ever wondered how St. Valentine’s shoulder blade looks like? You might have an opportunity to see it with your own eyes once a year at st. Peter and Paul’s church at Vysehrad, on Valentine’s day.

Havlíčkovy sady – a picnic area, a park, a vineyard, all in one. An oasis, located away from overcrowded city centre. You will never guess what they have there...

Břevnov monastery – these modern-day monks make beer and they have done so for over thousand years. Let tram 22 take you there.
